# International Women's Day Conference On Theme: "Pledge for Parity"

### World Water Day: Better Water, Better Jobs 22 March 2016

**What:** The Sindh Agriculture University, Tandojam in collaboration with the International Labour Organization (ILO) in Pakistan is organizing a seminar to commemorate this year's World Water Day in Tandojam, Sindh under the theme: "Better Water, Better Jobs." The United Nations has declared 22 March as the World Water Day (WWD) in order to magnify the international focus on water related issues and to inspire people and organizations to think about the link between the Water and Jobs. The ILO Director General, Mr. Guy Ryder, who is the ex-officio chair of the UN-Water Secretariat will launch the World Water Development Report on the same day in Geneva.

This year's theme is "Water and Jobs." The theme highlights how both water and jobs have the power to transform people's lives: water is essential to human survival, the environment, and the global economy. Safe working conditions and a living wage can provide workers with sustainable income and pave the way for broader social and economic advancements. A wide range of experts will discuss the inter linkages between the water and the jobs and how the labour markets will adversely affect from the water shortages in Pakistan that have started happening and will aggravate further as the time passes.

### **Background**

Nearly half of the world's labour force works in water-related sectors, but this figure doesn't even account for the countless women and children who participate in non-paid work revolving around water every single day. Millions of women and children in developing countries spend significant portions of their days gathering water for their family's drinking, cooking, cleaning, and bathing needs.

The Sindh Province, with its population of 34 million forms one-fifth of Pakistan's total population of 180 million. Approximately 51 percent of Sindh's population is rural, primarily depending on agriculture for their income and livelihoods. Sindh was the most severely affected province of the 2010 floods with close to 970,000 households suffering agricultural losses estimated at USD 2,301.6 million The impact of water bound disasters has, over the last five years, adversely affected Sindh Province of Pakistan resulting in poor income and vulnerable livelihoods.

The One-UN Livelihood Restoration Project implemented jointly by the ILO, FAO and UN Women has improved the water courses and the irrigation infrastructure through labour intensive methods. These initiatives have improved the irrigation efficiency, bettered the drainage system, created short term employment for the poorest peasant communities and sustainably improved their income levels through increasing their agriculture and livestock productivity.

The seminar aims to bring to light the knowledge generated on the subject and inspire collective thinking on the important issue of jobs in relation to water.
